# Ambassador Activities



Below is a list of suggested activities for ILC Ambassadors. These ideas can support your outreach efforts. Be sure to document and submit your actions through your Ambassador account. You're also welcome to explore additional initiatives beyond this list.

#### 1 Promote ILC on Social Media

Help spread awareness by sharing official ILC posts and information across platforms such as Facebook and Instagram. Tag the official pages to help increase visibility.

## 2 Add Your ILC Ambassador Role to Profiles

Display your ILC role proudly on your social and professional platforms like LinkedIn or Facebook. You can include a link to your ambassador profile.

#### 3 Share ILC with Friends and Classmates

Talk to peers in your school, university, or community about ILC, explaining what the competition is and why it's exciting. Encourage them to participate.

#### 4 Talk to Teachers and Coordinators

Introduce ILC to teachers, club mentors, and school officials. Provide information about the educator platform and special awards for schools.

### 5 Present ILC in Classes or Clubs

Give a brief presentation about the competition during a class session or club meeting to spark interest among students.

#### 6 Distribute Posters and Flyers

Print and hang official ILC posters at school, community centers, or libraries to attract attention. Digital copies can be found on the ILC website.

#### 7 Start a Linguistics Club or Group

Form a group at your school to explore linguistic problems together, host problem-solving

sessions, or use ILC problems to build engagement.

#### 8 Organize Linguistics Workshops or Events

Plan events like language analysis workshops, problem-solving showcases, or Q&A sessions where you introduce ILC and linguistic topics in an interactive way.

## 9 Create a Local Social Media Group

Establish a local WhatsApp or Facebook group for your school or city to coordinate ILC efforts and share updates.

### 10 Collaborate with Local Organizations

Work with local language clubs, academic institutions, or universities to promote ILC or co-host events that highlight the importance of linguistics.

## 11 Share ILC through Newsletters or Blogs

Submit a short article about ILC to your school's newsletter, student blog, or internal communication platforms.

## 12 Encourage Other Schools to Join

Extend outreach to other schools or universities in your area. Offer to share materials or connect them with the ILC organizing team.

# 13 Arrange Local Meetups

Organize informal meetups for interested students to discuss linguistic topics and learn more about the competition together.

# 14 Support the Qualification Round at Your School

Coordinate with teachers to hold a scheduled Qualification Round session and assist participants in preparing and submitting their solutions.

# 15 Represent ILC at Local Events

If your school or city hosts academic fairs, language fairs, or science days, represent ILC by setting up a booth or delivering a short talk.

## 16 Inspire Through Your Own Participation

Lead by example—participate actively in ILC and share your journey and insights with others to motivate them.
